### FIRST SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT

#### to the

### CITY OF GLENDORA FY 2023-2024 CDBG ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

## **BACKGROUND**

The City of Glendora (City) is an Entitlement Jurisdiction for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Annually, the City receives approximately \$300,000 in Entitlement funds to provide programs and services to the low- and moderate-income residents of the City.

As part of the 2023-2027 Consolidated Plan and the FY 2023-2024 Action Plan, the City allocated CDBG funds for the Street Improvement / Accessibility Project. The activities to be undertaken included installing accessibility ramps from sidewalks to the street to create a safe path of travel for seniors and the disabled. The location of the project was Census Tract 4039.02, Block Groups 1 and 3, and area with 52.6 percent low- and moderate-income households. A total of 2,955 households were to be benefitted.

## PROPOSED SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT

The original CDBG funding for this project was \$231,946. The funding was not adequate to do all the work necessary. The City has since identified additional CDBG funds which they propose to add to the FY 2023-2024 Street Improvement / Accessibility Project. Those funds include \$17,865 in savings from FY 2021-2022 projects and \$37,059 in prior-year unallocated funds. The City proposes to add the total amount of \$54,924 as shown below.

#### PUBLIC OUTREACH

A Notice of the proposed Substantial Amendment was published on February 29, 2024 in the San Gabriel Valley Examiner and posted at City Hall and on the City's website. A 30-day public comment period was held from March 22 to April 23, 2024. A public hearing was held before the Glendora City Council on April 23, 2024 and the proposed Substantial Amendment was approved. No public comments were received.
