## TRIP INFORMATION

No children under the age of 8 will be allowed on trips. When you are registering and paying for other people, you are the responsible party. Please ensure that your phone number, and the phone numbers of those in your party, is up to date. All trips depart from the City Parking Lot at Cullen and Mountain View across from Finkbiner Park. All trip tickets are non-transferrable.

**EASY-** Little walking, good for all!

**MODERATE-** Some walking necessary. Participants should be in good health and able to walk some distance without assistance. Destination activity level may be dependent on the individual.

**ACTIVE-** Good physical condition is necessary. Lots of walking included. Destination may not support walkers, canes, or wheelchairs. Please call staff if you have questions.

**HANDICAPPED-** Disabled-friendly trips accommodate a maximum of 2 wheelchairs per bus. Please note: There is a 30 day advance notice required to reserve a handicapped accessible bus, so make reservations early.

**NOTICE:** Due to current or potential changes to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health COVID-19 guidelines, or local city guidelines, certain trip venues may require proof of full vaccination against COVID-19. Please keep this in mind when registering for a trip. If a trip venue does not require full vaccination at the start of registration, but the guidance changes and the vaccine becomes required at a later date, participants who are unvaccinated may opt to receive a refund in lieu of attending the trip.

## BOWERS MUSEUM & ANAHEIM PACKING HOUSE

**Date: Wednesday, February 7** **10:30am-5:30pm**

Your first stop is a visit to the Anaheim Packing House for lunch on your own. In this famous food court, find over 30 unique vendors in a renovated Sunkist facility from 1919. Next, head to the Bowers Museum, an Orange County gem with 9 permanent collection exhibitions that showcase art and artifacts from cultures around the world. See exhibits including the Ancient Arts of China, California Bounty: Image and Identity, 1850-1930, First Californians, Ceramics of Western Mexico, Miao: Masters of Silver, Gemstone Carvings, and the Sacred Realms: Temple Murals, and more! Enjoy a docent-led tour to get the most of the experience.

Take a journey through history and explore the life and legacy of one of the most groundbreaking athletes of all time. Join Curt Tucker as you celebrate the early years of Jackie Robinson, followed by a behind-the-scenes look at the iconic Dodger Stadium. Begin in Pasadena where Jackie spent his formative years and discover why Pasadena was such an important place for him. Visit the Pasadena City Hall, where Jackie and his brother are memorialized, and then head to Dodger Stadium, home of the Los Angeles Dodgers since 1962. Get an exclusive look at this ballpark, including a walk through the Vin Scully Press Box. After the tour, enjoy lunch on your own at Philippe the Original, a historic LA landmark that has been around since 1908!

## CARLSBAD FLOWER FIELDS

Celebrate spring in the rolling hills of north San Diego County in one of the most spectacular and coordinated displays of natural color and beauty in the world. The 55 acres of Giant Tecolote Ranunculus are in bloom from early March through early May, bringing the famous fields back to life. Enjoy the Sweet Pea Blossom Maze, a tractor wagon ride, a butterfly garden, delicious food, and more! See the American Flag of Flowers, the orchid greenhouse, and the Artist Gardens & bird aviaries. Enjoy lunch on your own from one of the food carts at the fields.

## DESCANSO GARDENS

Explore the diversity of Southern California plants and examine the history of our local landscape at Descanso Gardens, a botanic garden and "museum of living collections". Descanso Gardens tells a tale unfolding over centuries – from indigenous people who relied on the plentiful oaks for food to the 20th-century entrepreneur who sowed the seeds of a cultural institution. Explore this urban oasis of cultivated gardens and wild, natural landscapes, and enjoy lunch on your own from one of Descanso Gardens dining options.

## CURT TUCKER-SHRINES AND FINDS

**Fee: \$100**

Join Curt Tucker along a docent-led tour at the Lincoln Memorial Shrine in Redlands, the only museum and archive west of the Mississippi that is dedicated to the study of Abraham Lincoln. The original building consisted of a one-room octagon with a Carrara marble bust of Lincoln by sculptor George Grey Barnard, along with inspiring excerpts from the Gettysburg Address and a mural representing the eight facets of Lincoln's character. Next, enjoy lunch on your own at the Riverside Food Lab, the Inland Empire's first food hall that showcases over a dozen delicious restaurants. End your day with a visit to the Riverside Art Museum's newest addition: the Cheech Marin Center for Chicano Arts & Culture. This one-of-a-kind private art collection from actor and comedian Cheech Marin includes a two-story lenticular art piece dedicated solely to Chicano art. The ground floor hosts galleries with more than 550 paintings and drawings from artists in the Chicano art movement.
